AGREED ORDER

Comes the Kentucky Board of Chiropractic Examiners, hereafter the "Board," and Jeffrey T. Stallings, D.C., hereafter the "Respondent," and the parties hereby agree as follows:

1. That on or about February 23, 1998, the Board received a *Malpractice Payment Report* on the Respondent;
2. That the Board investigated the matter and found evidence the Respondent had not complied with minimum standards for recordkeeping in violation of 201 KAR 21:100;
3. That Respondent admits he failed to meet minimum standards for recordkeeping as established in 201 KAR 21:100;
4. That rather than pursue a hearing on this violation of law, the parties have decided to resolve this matter by means of this Agreed Order.

WHEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that:

- a. The Respondent shall complete 6 hours of continuing education in recordkeeping and tender proof of same to the Board. Proof of completion

of the continuing education hours shall be sent to the Board no later than April 1, 1999. The Board will accept proof of previously completed hours of recordkeeping so long as the continuing education was completed after March 1, 1998;

- b. The Respondent shall pay a penalty of \$1000 to the Board on or before February 1, 1999;
- c. The Respondent enters into this Agreed Order knowingly, willingly and voluntarily and after having reviewed the due process rights afforded to him under KRS Chapter 312 and the accompanying regulations;
- d. The Respondent understands that by signing this Agreed Order, he has waived his right to a hearing on the allegations, including the right to be present with counsel, to subpoena witnesses and to confront those against him, and the right to appeal the Board's decision as entered in the Agreed Order and the full panoply of rights of hearing and appeal as authorized by statute, regulation and court decision;
- e. This Agreed Order is subject to disclosure under the Kentucky Open Records Act;
- f. The Respondent acknowledges he is ineligible for participation in any chiropractic preceptorship program for five years pursuant to 201 KAR 21:085, Section 2(7);

- g. The Respondent agrees that his failure to comply with any of the terms of this Agreed Order may result in the Board setting this matter for hearing.
