***AGREED ORDER***

Comes the Kentucky Board of Chiropractic Examiners, hereafter the "Board," by counsel, and Julie Martin, D.C., hereafter the "Respondent," and the parties hereby agree as follows:

1. That on or about September 13, 1997, the Peer Review Committee appointed by the Board referred a case involving the Respondent to the Board for possible failure to meet the minimum standards for recordkeeping;
2. That Respondent admits she failed to meet minimum standards for recordkeeping as established in 201 KAR 21:100, and has taken substantial steps to remediate this violation;
3. That rather than pursue a hearing on this violation of law, the parties have decided to resolve this matter by means of this Agreed Order.

WHEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that:

- a. The Respondent accepts the reprimand of the Board for the above-stated violation. The Respondent agrees she will act more diligently in the future to insure that the minimum standards for recordkeeping are met;
- b. The Respondent will, in addition to this current year's continuing education requirements, complete an additional 6 hours of continuing education in

recordkeeping. The Board agrees to recognize additional continuing education programs completed by the Respondent since January 1, 1998;


- c. Unless requested, the Board shall make no referral of this matter;
- d. The Respondent enters into this Agreed Order knowingly, willingly and voluntarily having reviewed the due process rights afforded to her under KRS Chapter 312 and the accompanying regulations;
- e. The Respondent understands that by signing this Agreed Order, she has waived her right to a hearing on the allegations, including the right to be present with counsel, to subpoena witnesses and to confront those against her, and the right to appeal the Board's decision as entered in the Agreed Order and the full panoply of rights of hearing and appeal as authorized by statute, regulation and court decision;
- f. This Agreed Order is subject to disclosure under the Kentucky Open Records Act;
- g. The Respondent acknowledges she is ineligible for participation in any chiropractic preceptorship program for five years pursuant to 201 KAR 21:085, Section 2(7);
- h. The Respondent agrees that her failure to comply with any of the terms of this Agreed Order may result in the Board setting this matter for hearing.


